The following recyclable items will be accepted: cardboard (flattened), #1-7 plastics (rinsed & flattened), mixed paper, tin and aluminum (rinsed and flattened).

Please note: Clean-Up Day is for residents of Leslie Township only!

Following is a list of materials that will be prohibited in the Clean-Up Day dumpsters:

- 1. Appliances containing Freon
- 2. LP tanks
- 3. Ignitable, corrosive, reactive, or toxic material
- 4. Radioactive materials
- 5. Hazardous waste or containers with hazardous waste labels
- 6. Liquid wastes such as oils, solvents, paints, chemicals, pesticides, etc...
- 7. Yard waste or compost material
- 8. Tires
- Appliances with Freon coolant properly removed must be tagged in order to be accepted.
- A scrap metal disposal service will be available at no charge.

2020 will be a very busy election year for Leslie Township residents with 3 elections occurring: March, August and November. With the passing of Proposal 18-3 in November 2018, you may now request an absent voter ballot without stating a reason. However, to vote absentee you must request your ballot in writing. You may acquire an absentee application by stopping at the office, calling to request one (517-589-8201), or printing from website by one our leslietownship.org.

If you are <u>NOT</u> currently on the Permanent Absent Voter list and would like to be, please complete and return the Permanent Absentee Voter Registration Response Card which the clerk will be mailing to you in October. Please contact the office if you have not received a card by mid-October.

Interested in a paid position as an Election Inspector for 2020 elections? Please stop by the township during office hours (Monday - Friday 9:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.) to request an application.

Township Board Meetings are the 2nd Wednesday of each month (with the exception of July) at 6:00 p.m. - Leslie Township business office.

MOCK VOTING FOR KIDS

Have your children participated in the mock voting for kids at the polls on election day? This opportunity will once again be available for the August and November elections. Each child who wishes to participate will receive a 1 or 2 question ballot to vote. They will then deposit their voted ballot into a special ballot box. 2020 CENSUS AND YOU

April 1, 2020 is Census Day, the date by which you should have received your invitation to respond to the 2020 Census. The U.S. Constitution (Article 1, Section 2) mandates a headcount every 10 years of everyone residing in the United States. Did you know:

- * Census data is used for distribution of over \$675 billion annually in federal funds to states and communities.
- * Census numbers are used in drawing congressional and legislative districts, school districts and for planning for future facilities, programs and services.
- * The law states that the information you provide may be used <u>only</u> for statistical purposes and nothing else. The Census Bureau is required by law to protect any personal information provided: census.gov/privacy.
- * You have the option of responding online, by mail, or by phone once you receive your initial invitation. If you do not respond by one of these methods by April 27, 2020 you will be visited by a census taker to collect the information in person.
- * The U.S. Census Bureau will be hiring Census Takers. Apply online at: 2020census.gov/jobs or call 1-855-562-2020.
